Sentences

Put each of your words into separate sentences. Underline your words with a coloured pencil. OR type these sentences onto a google document, highlight/ underline the spelling words and submit.

Dot Pain Words

Use a cotton bud or a paint brush to write your words by dotting each letter. e.g.



Add Your Words

Add your words together. Vowels = 10, Consonants = 5

e.g. said 5 + 10 + 10 + 5 = 30 *Can change numbers for a challenge

Alliteration

Put each of your words in different alliterative sentences.

e.g. Sally spells sixty silly sentences.

Spelling Artist

Draw a picture for each word. Write the word next to it. e.g.

Synonym

Find a synonym for your spelling words. Remember a synonym is a word that means the same.

e.g. little: small

Lego Words

Make your words using pieces of lego to build each letter.

Set a timer and write your words as many times as you can in one minute.

Scrabble Words
